Stories of the Untamed Jesus

WHAT a MOTHER WANTS to KNOW:

Jesus got into the boat again and went back to the other side of the lake, where a large crowd gathered around him on the shore. Then a leader of the local synagogue, whose name was Jairus, arrived. When he saw Jesus, he fell at his feet, pleading fervently with him. "My little daughter is dying," he said. "Please come and lay your hands on her; heal her so she can live." Jesus went with him, and all the people followed, crowding around him. Mark 5:21-24 (NLT)

A woman in the crowd had suffered for twelve years with constant bleeding. She had suffered a great deal from many doctors, and over the years she had spent everything she had to pay them, but she had gotten no better. In fact, she had gotten worse. Mark 5:25-26 (NLT)

WHAT EVERY MOTHER NEEDS:

She had heard about Jesus, so she came up behind him through the crowd and touched his robe. For she thought to herself, "If I can just touch his robe, I will be healed." Mark 5:27-28 (NLT)

Immediately the bleeding stopped, and she could feel in her body that she had been healed of her terrible condition. Jesus realized at once that healing power had gone out from him, so he turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who touched my robe?" His disciples said to him, "Look at this crowd pressing around you. How can you ask, 'Who touched me?'" But he kept on looking around to see who had done it. Then the frightened woman, trembling at the realization of what had happened to her, came and fell to her knees in front of him and told him what she had done. And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well. Go in peace. Your suffering is over." Mark 5:29-34 (NLT)

"Charlie and the Chocolate Factory" is a story about moms. In the movie, masterful chocolatier Willy Wonka has hidden five golden tickets in candy bars. The tickets have created worldwide pandemonium as people all over the world desperately search for a golden ticket. But it's not the golden ticket that's valuable, it's the prize. Whoever finds a golden ticket will receive a tour of Wonka's factory and a lifetime supply of chocolate.

After four tickets have been found, a boy named Charlie finds the fifth. Although he would like nothing more than to meet Willy Wonka, he considers selling the ticket. His family is poor and could use the money, but Charlie's wise grandpa speaks up: 'There's plenty of money out there. They print more every day. But this ticket, there's only five of them in the whole world, and that's all there's ever going to be. Only a dummy would give this up for something as common as money. Are you a dummy?'

Many moms struggle with the curse of commonness. Wiping kids' noses, making school lunches, and doing loads of laundry, can, after awhile, start to wear on a mom. She might begin to feel that every day is the same, that her home is her prison, and sometimes, when the curse sets in, she might question her very existence:

'Wasn't I made for more than this?' she might ask, as she wipes the egg off the floor and, while bending over, spies a long hair sprouting from her once-smooth ankles. She might remember the nights she stayed out past nine and the mornings she slept in past seven. She might even remember when she used to feel pretty. In these moments, it's wise to remember the words of Charlie's grandpa: 'Are you a dummy?'

Well are you? **There's absolutely nothing common about being a mom**, nothing common to the position. How can it be common when you're feeding the hungry or clothing the naked? How can it be common when you're loving the needy or teaching the young? How can it be common when you're healing the sick or leading the lost? It can't be common, not when you're the hands of God.

So resist the curse and treat yourself to some chocolate. Happy Mother's Day, you most uncommon mom!
